



BEFORE ARRIVAL

- **Travel Documents**
We would like to recommend you travelling with your passport and study visa. Other travelling documents could be required on the basis of your citizenship.
- **Fiscal Code**
It is strongly recommended to apply for the Italian Fiscal Code at the Embassy/Consulate.
This alphanumeric identifying code is compulsory at the moment of the enrolment and getting it in advance will save your time at your arrival
- **Enrolment documents**
Remember to have with you all the originals of your documents useful for enrolment, together with CIMEA certificates.
- **ERDIS call for scholarship application**
To have the possibility of entering the dorms and benefiting from the regional scholarship apply for the ERDIS call at www.erdis.it
Even if you are interested in a place upon payment you have to apply for the relevant call.
- **Medical certificate**
It is compulsory to enter in dorms and it has to be issued not before 15 days from your arrivals. For a further check, please contact ERDIS offices.
- **Money**
All the main types of cards (Visa, MasterCard) are accepted in shops and supermarket.
In alternative, we recommend you prepare some euros (€) in advance.
Opening a bank account in Italy could be expensive so we suggest you ask for a prepaid card with IBAN code that is cheaper and faster to obtain. Some banks could ask you for the final residence permit, sometimes the residence permit application receipt could be accepted instead.

AFTER ARRIVAL

- **Residence permit application (around 120€)**
Within 8 working days from your arrival, you must submit the residence permit application kit. The Welcome Office will support you in the procedure, but you need to provide for:
 - photocopies of your passport (all the pages even if empty)
 - a revenue stamp or MARCA DA BOLLO of 16€ (to be bought at the tobacconist)
 - the KIT for application (available at the local post office for free)
 - proof of accommodation
- **University enrolment documents**
To enrol at the University, you must submit all the compulsory documents in original together with CIMEA certificates to the Student Registry.
Fiscal code and residence permit application receipts are mandatory to finalize the procedure.
- **University fees**
The first instalment of 156€ related to regional fees must be paid at the moment of the enrolment apart from the scholarship. The second instalment depends on the scholarship and could amount to max 300€.
- **Fiscal Code (if not required at the Embassy/Consulate)**
The Fiscal Code is one of the mandatory documents to finalize the enrolment.
If you did not apply for it at the Embassy/Consulate, please reach the Welcome Office to apply for it.
- **Medical Health Insurance (up to 700€)**
For the first months from your arrival and to get the first residence permit, the University offers its students a medical insurance. However, starting from January each year, it is strongly recommended to apply for a personal medical insurance since it is mandatory to maintain the residence permit. It is possible to choose for a private medical insurance or apply for the National Health System (NHS). Even if the cost of 700€ for the NHS is understandably high, this covers all the medical expenses in case of hospitalization and gives the same benefits of Italians.
- **Local Bus ticket**
All the students can benefit from free local bus ticket. As soon as the Student Registry gives you the student number, you can use it to receive your bus ticket for free at the CONTRAM bus station. You will receive a monthly card that can be renewed thanks to the CONTRAM mobile app.
